- ◆ **Five high-quality jpg images on CD:** Please save files as: "Last Name of artist\_title (*abbrev.*). For example, "Smith\_Mountain.jpg." Images between 1MB and 10 MB, please, no larger. Write the file names on the entry form along with the other information required for each piece.

And:

- ◆ **A brief resume** (for reference only; it is not used by the jury).
- ◆ **Entry Fee: \$15** (non-refundable).
- ◆ **A Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope** for return of your slides/CD. Shelburne Farms will not be responsible for returning material without a SASE and necessary packing materials. **PLEASE BE SURE YOUR SASE IS THE APPROPRIATE SIZE.**
- ◆ **A completed entry form.**

**All entries must be received no later than April 12, 2010 to the address below. Please allow plenty of mailing time.** Notification of the results will be sent out in mid-June, 2010.

# CALL FOR ENTRIES

## Art at the Coach Barn

September 24 - October 24, 2010

Over its 22 years, the Shelburne Farms annual art exhibition and sale has become an important arts event in the Champlain Valley region. Hosted at the Coach Barn, the annual show displays the work of 40-45 artists. Approximately, one-third of the artists are invited and the rest are juried.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

Your application must include:

- Five high quality jpgs on CD: Please save files as: "Last Name of artist\_title (abbrev.). For example, "Smith\_Mountain.jpg." No files larger than 10 MB, please. Write file names on the entry form along with the other information required for each piece.

Your application must also include:

- A completed entry form
- A brief resume.
- Entry Fee: \$15 (non-refundable)
- A Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope for return of your CD. *Please make sure your SASE is the appropriate size.* Shelburne Farms will not be responsible for returning material without a SASE that is the correct size.

### ARTWORK

All mediums are accepted. Artwork must have been created within the last two years, and cannot have been shown in the Burlington, Vermont area. Selected artists may submit up to five pieces to the show; Shelburne Farms guarantees to exhibit a minimum of two.

### ART SALES

All pieces submitted must be for sale. Shelburne Farms retains a 40% commission on work sold during the show or within 30 days of its closing. Proceeds from the exhibit benefit our education programs.
